IVI celebrates first anniversary

Aksauhini provides vision for the future

To enable excellence in eyecare and position India as a world leader is the focus of *Aksauhini*, the all-India strategic plan launched on the occasion of the first anniversary of IVI.

Aksauhini sets out a framework to improve eye care in India by providing excellent and equitable eyecare solutions, assist in eliminating visual impairment and avoidable blindness, ensure optometry is a vibrant and recognized profession and assist the development of the Indian eyecare industry to become a world leader.

For implementation over the next five years, 16 strategic projects have been identified with an estimated funding requirement for the first three years of the plan being INR 80 crores. The projects are aimed at raising public awareness and building professional recognition, ramping-up human resource development, ensuring minimum standards of diagnostic and clinical infrastructure and developing an innovative vision care technology sector in India. Presentation on Optometry Schools in India by IVI Team during IAPB 9GA

With only 49,000 four and two year trained optometrists currently available in India, against the demand for 115,000 optometrists, there exists a big gap in demand and supply impacting the delivery of eye care in India.

With this background, IVI Senior Program Manager, Mr Abhishek Kalbarga, presented a "status report on Optometry Schools in India" at the IAPB 9 GA.



Low Vision Awareness Program

IVI in association with the LVPEI organised a Low Vision Awareness Program (LAP) at LVPEI on 21 September 2012. LAP is an exclusive orientation program providing a broad overview of low vision care and rehabilitation of the visually impaired.

Over 100 optometry professionals, educators and students attended the exclusive one day program with support from IVI.

Discussion of case studies and hands-on practicals with access to advanced low vision devices were successful in instilling confidence among participants to examine and treat patients with low vision. The workshop was lead by Dr Vijaya K Gothwal, Head, Meera & Dr L B Deshpande Centre for Sight Enhancement, LVPEI.

IVI Upcoming Workshops

Capacity building workshops for Optometry Educators in Eastern India

IVI is planning to conduct a series of capacity building workshops for educators in Kolkata and Shillong in early February 2013.

Workshop on Non Strabismic Binocular Vision Anomalies

Binocular vision anomalies are one of the most frequently encountered ocular problems. To address this issue, IVI Academy for Eyecare Educators will conduct a two day workshop on Non Strabismic Binocular Vision Anomalies at IVI on 19-20 November 2012.

The workshop will focus on behavioural optometry, non strabismic binocular vision anomalies and clinical evaluation, followed by a hands-on session to discuss case studies. Eminent speakers including Mr Aditya Goyal and Mr Diwakar Rao from Sankara School of Optometry, Dr Shrikant Bharadwaj from LVPEI, Ms Sunita Agarwal from Drishtikone and Ms Jameel Rizwana from Sankara Netralaya will address the frequently found set of anomalies. Workshop on Biostatistics and Scientific Writing in collaboration with AVRI

India Vision Institute (IVI) in collaboration with the African Vision Research Institute (AVRI) Durban, South Africa, is organising a "Workshop on Biostatistics and Scientific Writing" on 6-8 December 2012 at Hyderabad.

The workshop will focus on several introductory topics in biostatistics which form the basis for further methods such as linear regression, logistic regression and survival analysis. The workshop is also intended to help eye health cadres and researchers develop their skills in written communication and make them more effective in sharing their knowledge through scientific papers, reports and peer reviewed articles.

The workshop would be led by Dr Tom Were Okello and Mr Farai Chinanyi from AVRI. The last date for registration is **15 November 2012**.
