IVI Young Optometry Researcher Rolling Trophy

IVI Online Seminars for Students

An online seminar for Optometry students on 'Introducing Perceptual Disorders' was presented by Mr Aditya Goyal-Principal, Sankara College of Optometry, Bangalore on Friday, 6 November.

Over 200 students from Down Town College of Optometry in Guwahati, NSHM Knowledge Campus in Kolkata, Ridley College of Optometry in Jorhat, Sri Jayendra Saraswathi Institute of Optometry in Chennai, C L Gupta Eye Institute, Moradabad and Vidya Sagar College of Optometry and Vision Science in Kolkata attended the seminar.

The seminar focused on the concept of perception, its measurement and its measurability; importance of case history and categories of Developmental Visual Information Process (DVIP). This was the 15th seminar in the IVI online students' seminar series launched in August 2013.

Workshop on Ocular Prosthetics

IVI organized a one- day comprehensive workshop on Ocular Prosthetics in collaboration with Dr D Y Patil Institute of Optometry and Visual Sciences in Pune on 21 November. Facilitated by Mr Sachin Gupta, Director, Art Eyes, New Delhi, the workshop focused on introduction to Ocularisty, disfigurement of eye, making and fitting of prosthetic eyes and managing ocular discharge. The presentation was followed by a live demonstration of procedures involved in making of Ocular prosthetics at the institute laboratory.

Participants appreciated the workshop on a specialist topic seldom discussed in the academic circles; and expressed interest in attending advanced modules of the workshop in future. The workshop was attended by over 40 Optometry practitioners, educators and students from Dr D Y Patil Institute of Optometry and Visual Sciences, Pune; Bharati Vidyapeeth University, Pune; Laxmi College of Optometry, Mumbai and Nagar School of Optometry, Ahmedabad among other Optometry institutes and eye hospitals across India.

The workshop was awarded 05 credit points by Optometry Council of India (OCI).

Online Seminar for Optometry Professionals

IVI facilitated online participation of over 50 Optometry professionals including practitioners and Optometry educators for a presentation on Charles Bonnet Syndrome (CBS) hosted by LVPEI- KAR Campus in Hyderabad on Wednesday 4 November.

The session was facilitated by Mr Scot Muirden, Director, Charles Bonnet Syndrome Foundation (CBSF), Australia. Mr Muirden introduced the audience to the concept of CBS and how it can cause vivid, complex, recurring visual hallucinations, usually (but not only) in older adults with later-life vision loss and discussed about further required interventions.

EyeTeach - Problem Based Learning

Responsible for coordinating the India component, IVI facilitated the participation of two Indian academics in the online EyeTeach: Problem Based Learning course offered by Brien Holden Vision Institute (BHVI) during 27 July to 28 August. Offered to Optometry educators globally, participants from six countries undertook the course.

Facilitated by Helen Dalton and Jude Stern from BHVI, the course was the next step for educators having previously attended one of the foundational EyeTeach programs on Education Design for Learning comprising: From Clinician to Educator, Education Design for Learning (online) and Faculty Development Programs offered under the Australian Award Fellowship (AAF).

The course encouraged participation of educators in understanding the role of problem-based learning in engaging students and preparing them for professional practice. Feedback and reflection on the learning process were imperative components of the interactive format of course delivery.

IVI Online Series for Institutional Development

Focusing on the need for additional student support development programs and current practices in faculty performance trackers, the fifth session in the IVI Online Series for Institutional Development was facilitated by Ms Helen Dalton, Education Consultant, Brien Holden Vision Institute Academy on 26 November.

Attended by heads of nine Optometry Schools, the session focused on factors that reinforce quality education at Optometry schools; how quality education can be promoted using the presage, process and product method; and how student supporting services can be developed by dedicating an advisor, maintaining a learning centre and providing them with psychological and counseling services.

IVI Reaches Out to Flood Affected People in Chennai

IVI is conducting a series of vision screening programs through December'15 and January'16 as a relief measure to provide free spectacles to those from disadvantaged communities who lost their spectacles in the recent floods causing severe destruction in and around Chennai.

The campaign began on 16 December with the first vision screening organized in Palavakkam, in the presence of Mr Viswanathan, Councilor, Palavakkam; Mr Dharmaprasad Rai, Head, Essilor Vision Foundation and Mr Vinod Daniel, CEO of IVI. Similar screening programs followed in Madipakkam, Pallikaranai and Saidapet. Over 930 people were screened and more than 600 were diagnosed with refractive errors and would receive free spectacles.



Mr P Ramachandran (Group COO, Essilor India Pvt Ltd), Mr Rangarajan Sourirajan (COO, Essilor India Pvt Ltd), Mr Rajagopal Narasimhan (Regional Vice President–South, Essilor India Pvt Ltd) and Mr Dharmaprasad Rai (Head, Essilor Vision Foundation) were present at the screening program in Pallikaranai and spectacle distribution program in Palavakkam.

Optometrists Ms Sony, Ms Sandhya and Mr Revanth from IVI conducted the vision screening. Optometrists Mr Siva Kumar, Ms Janani and Mr Ambika Ram volunteered at the screening programs. Mr Ravindhran and Mr Babu provided Jaya Sankara Marriage Hall and Neelambal Marriage Hall free of cost for organizing the screenings.

Further campaigns are planned across flood affected areas in Chennai including in Red Hills, Kotturpuram and Triplicane among others.
